Inge incorporates tablet weaving into fabric, all woven on a floor loom. She dyes the warps and embellishes as well. Several members delighted in modeling the exquisite garments. The workshop followed that weekend. We warped the tablets then put them on looms that had been warped with a gap in the center of the fabric for where the tablets and warp were placed. Very challenging on certain looms, lots learned.

Winter weather caused cancellation of both December and January meetings.

February Cathy McMurray, a new member, shared ideas and strategies for marketing yourself and your work online. Social media is a big part of her strategy. Cathy has a successful website and sells on Etsy.
