The October program found the Webfoot Weavers reviewing the set-up and use of our triangle loom. The loom is owned by the Guild. It was brought out to instruct both newer and seasoned weavers to the capabilities of a triangle loom. The exercise proved hilarious as it begged the question, "how many weavers does it take to set up a triangle loom". The answer remains an in-house secret.

Because of the 'fun' from October, the November program saw the Guild continuing the discussion of the triangle loom. We also had a wonderful presentation from a new member about evaluating our weaving projects. The evaluation exercise included a written document for personal files. This evaluation showed weavers how to look at the project for the aesthetic value, craftsmanship, and functionality.

In December, Webfoot Weavers met at a local restaurant for the yearly holiday luncheon. We had a cookie exchange and a white elephant give and take.

January was the annual business meeting that included the yearly budget, program planning, and assigning members to bring edible treats for each 2020 meeting.

After the usual quick business portion of our meetings, in February the members were treated to a program in how to make stitch markers.

March found the Guild members enjoying a hands-on, off loom project making medallions and art pieces using a 3 inch round weaver. The round weavers come in various sizes, from 1 inch to 5 inches, and are intended for one-time use, making it perfect for earrings or necklaces. Working without a big table or floor loom introduced the members to other types of weaving.
