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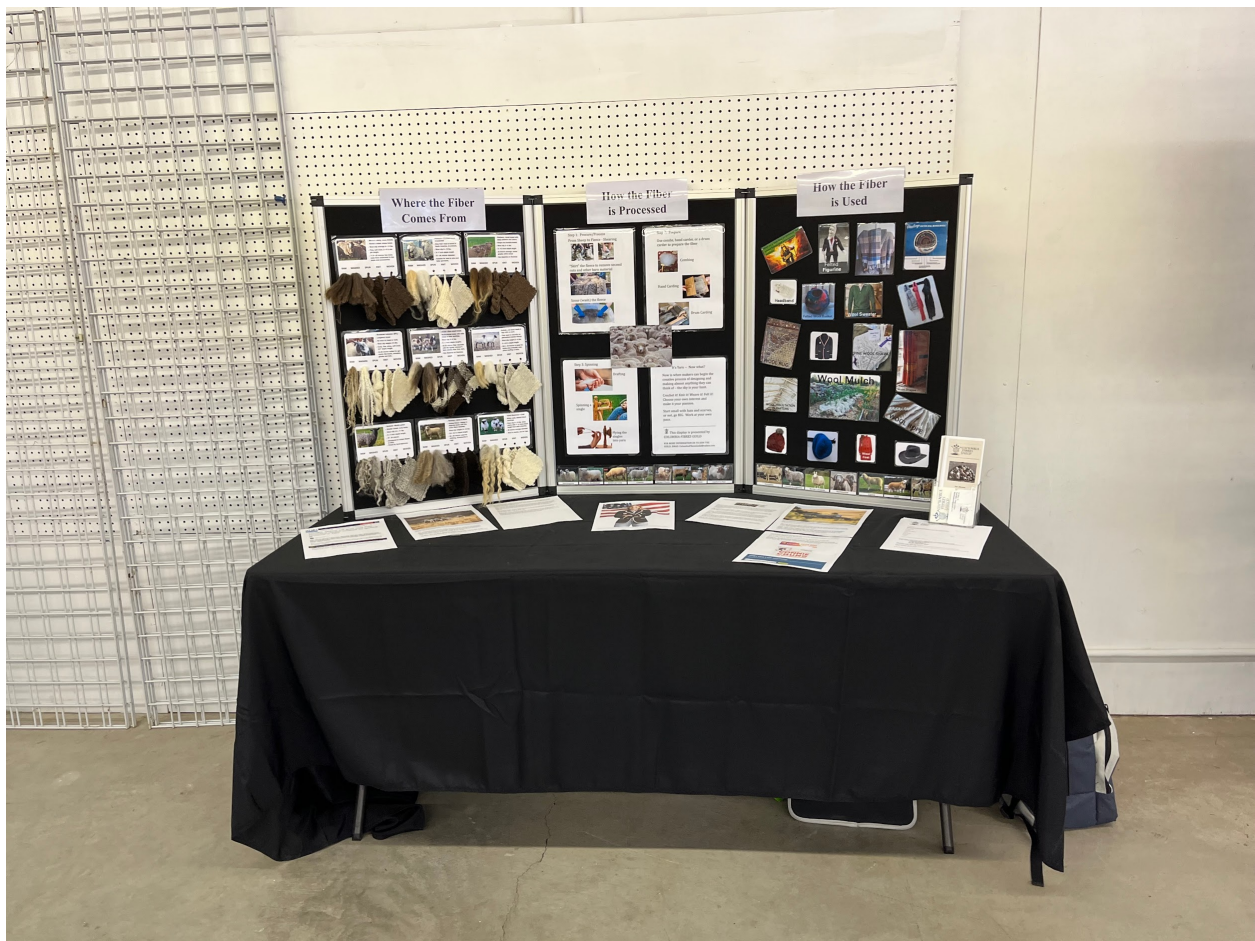
April went to Pendleton Woolen Mills In Washougal for a tour. They have updated their equipment since last time we toured. All had a great time and got all the history of their existence.
