November 2025

The guild program was “Viking Weaving with Wire” presented by Lisa. Handouts, a video, and extra large visual aids were used to explain the technique, and completed bracelets, necklaces and tools needed were on display. Also presented was the RVHG Shawl and Scarf Community Project started with WeGO scholarship funds. Guidelines for the program were distributed.

Our guild program for March was “Pile Weaves” presented by Martha. She discussed the various types and construction of pile weaves, and presented many samples from her tapestry loom.
